You can prompt them by asking questions such as:

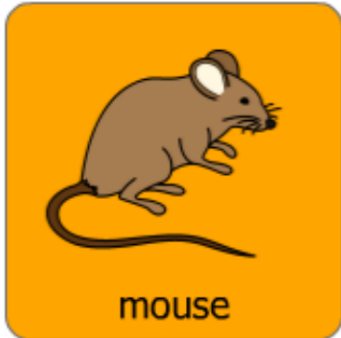
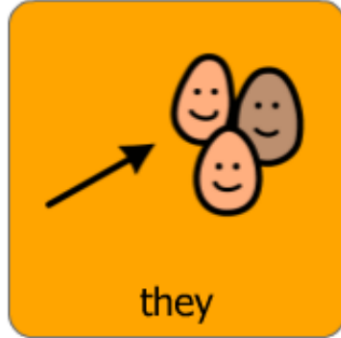
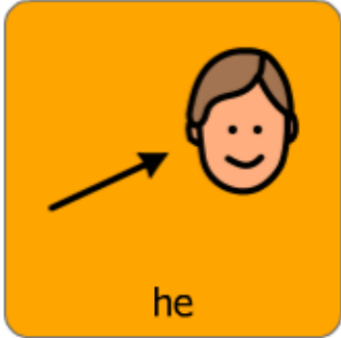
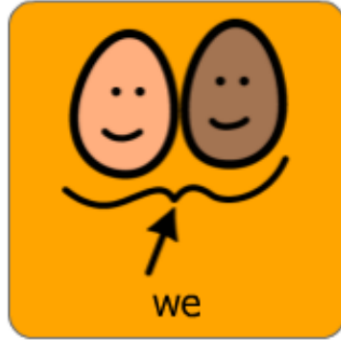
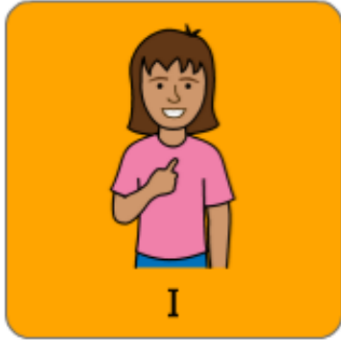
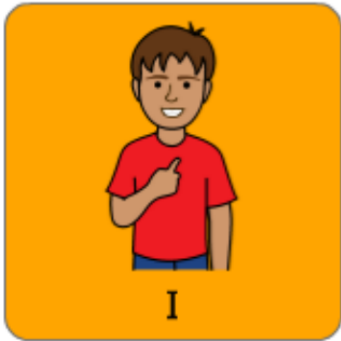
