



2HARDER \rightarrow 2 HARDEST 3 EASY \rightarrow 3 HARDER \rightarrow 3 HAREDST [NBGIVE is included in 3 EASY but thematically it's 3 HARDEST 4 EASY \rightarrow 4 HARDER \rightarrow 4 HARDEST
