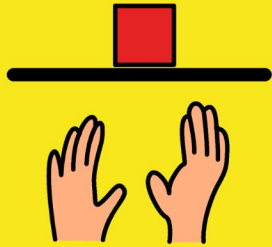
Christmas Baking

You can use this pack with children when talking about baking. Use this before to talk about what you will do, or afterwards to support children with re-telling the activity.

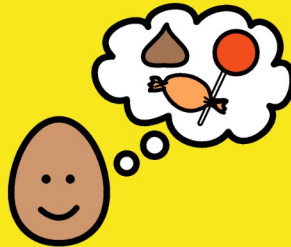


You can prompt them by asking questions such as:- What did you bake?- What ingredients did you use?- What utensils did you use?- What did you do first? What did your baking taste like?
