



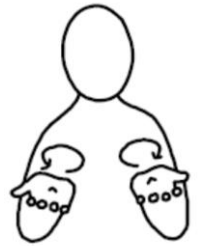
## Where?

1. Introduce the 'where' Makaton sign alongside the blue-coloured cue card.

2. Depending on the age/ability of the child, the tasks to teach 'where?' may vary.

Below are some examples for younger children:

- A picture book
- Pulling symbols or pictures out of a bag.
- Posting symbols or pictures into a letterbox.
- Talking about where people/animals live e.g. in a house, on a farm, at the zoo



Below are some examples for older children:

- A book which they are reading in school e.g. Oxford Reading Tree
- Using the blue 'where' symbols or pictures and asking them to turn them over e.g. pairs.
- Talk about where different events take place e.g. WHERE do you play/buy food/cook dinner/go to bed. Could use role play or toys such as a dolls' house to introduce new vocabulary of places.

For all tasks, you would then ask the child 'where is the boy?'. When asking this, it should be accompanied by the Makaton sign and the blue-coloured card. You could have a choice of different 'where' pictures if they child needs forced choices/options to choose from.
