### TALC Picture Assessment Percentage Scores

This table gives the percentage of correct answers at each level. For example, if a child scored 3 at level 4 then 17% of his answers were correct at level 4. If the child scored 15 at level 3 then 88% of his answers were correct at level 3.

If the child achieves at 80% or more he can be said to be competent at that level of the Blank Model. His understanding at this level should be reinforced during everyday situations and targets set to help him work at the next level.

If the child achieves at less that 80% he needs more opportunities to practise at this level. Advice and activities can be found in Language Builders and Early Language Builders (available through Elklan). The assessment can be repeated and changes in the percentage achieved can be used to monitor progress.
