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

NOTES FOR TEACHERS

The Write Reason is a collection of worksheets designed to encourage independent narrative writing, from sentence formation to story writing. The pictures and activities within the book require pupils to access information from a variety of sources including pictures and charts and then to use it in their writing.

The sheets provide opportunities for pupils to write at different levels and for different purposes. These include selecting words to make sentences, using information from charts and free writing. *The Write Reason* is designed to be used flexibly at the discretion of the teacher. The section on *scenes*, for example, could be used at several levels, ranging from writing simple sentences to descriptive writing. During our successful trials of the book, many teachers told us that they found it useful for other areas of the English Curriculum. *Charts*, for example, can be used as the basis of comprehension exercises, the *scenes* provide ample opportunity for speaking and listening activities and the *sentence makers* are useful for grammar work.

The book has a wide appeal: it is suitable for Key Stage 2 pupils and may also be used with some Key stage 1 and Key Stage 3 pupils. It is particularly suitable for sentence level work in the Literacy Hour. *The Write Reason* relates to National Curriculum English Attainment target 3 (Writing) level 2 and the Scottish English Language 5-14 Writing, levels A and B.

Please note that the lines at the top of the *scenes* and *stories from pictures* are intended for the teacher or pupil to write in a suitable title.






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
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





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










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






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










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
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
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
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










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









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











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


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The Write Reason
