I do usually ask for both settings to complete a profile. It can be interesting to see if a child performs differently in either setting. Children can behave entirely differently at home/school, so its often worth looking at.

The profile we used is officially for age 5-10, with extra scoring bits for ages 3-4. However, if you are not taking a deal of notice of the scoring, it serves as a useful set of questions for using with anyone, so its up to you. There is an adolescent version too, but I don't have it. Probably should, but don't!

It comes from the Psychological Corporation. But you can google it and see where you can get it from at best price?

I think I had my last set of score sheets from Pearsons – but its always worth checking who's cheapest and often when you are buying the manual as well as the score sheets, you get the best deal buying a pack.
