
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Point to the words.. 'either.' and 'or '. as you give the child the instructions... or use the flashcards.





Either...or Action Game










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Either/Or Story

Instructions Look at the pictures while I tell you the story. Listen carefully, because I'm going to ask you some questions about the story when I've finished.


- Picture 1 Jack and his friends were playing football in the park.

- Picture 16 "Next time we play footie, it'll be either in my garden or in yours," said Jack. "Agreed" said Ben."


