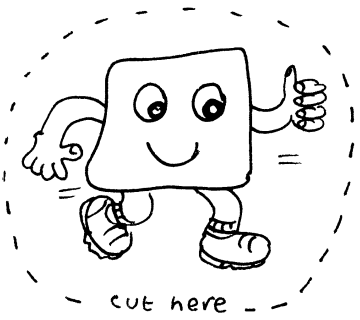

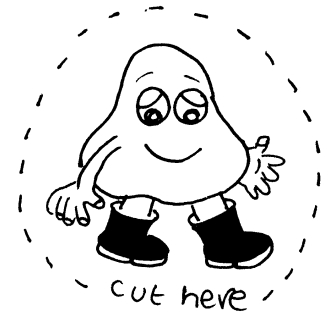

..... and I'm Slow Joe

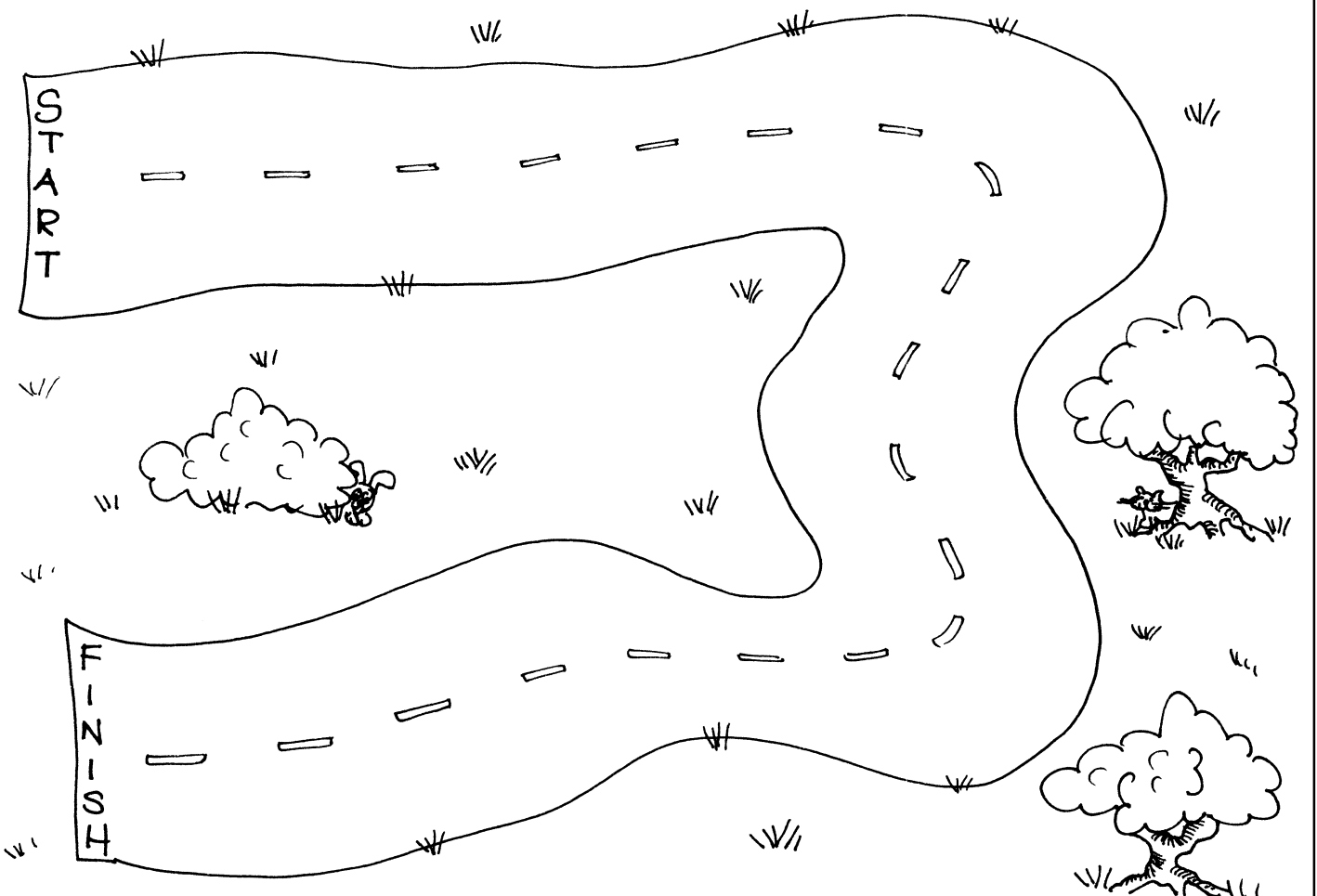


... and we're here to talk about our special words...

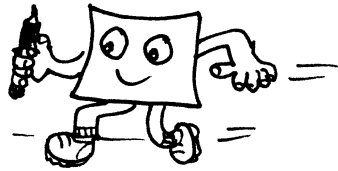
... QUICKLY.. and ... SLOWLY

These words describe the speed we do something.

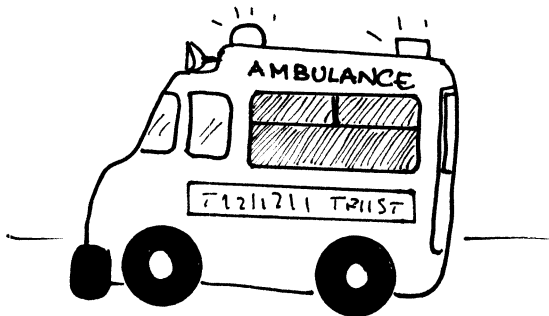
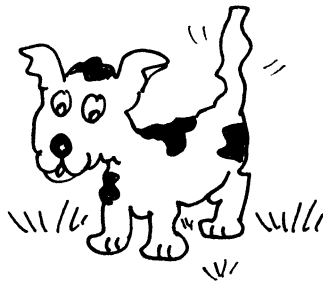
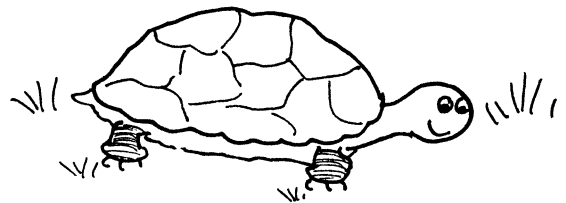
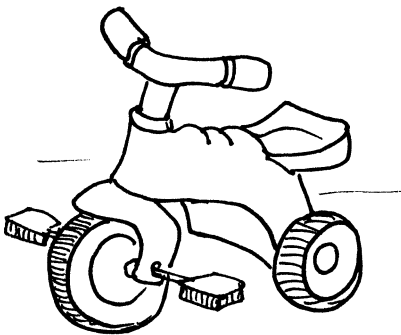
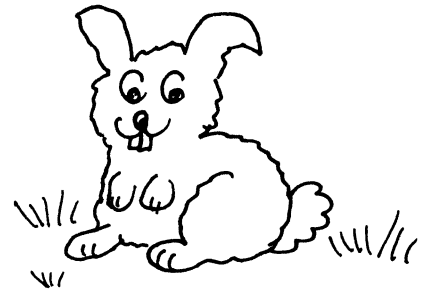
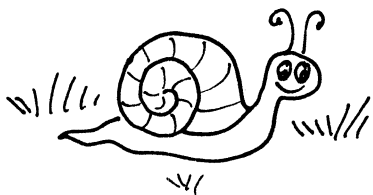
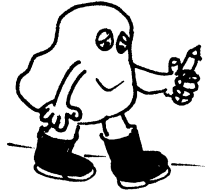
Cut out the pictures of Quincy Quick and Slow Joe. Make them "walk" along the path. Quincy walks QUICKLY... Joe walks SLOWLY

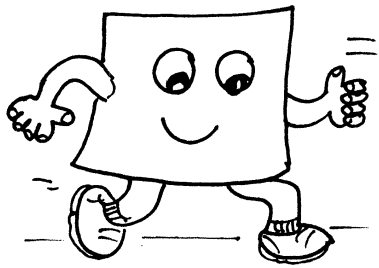


Draw a blue circle around the things that move quickly.



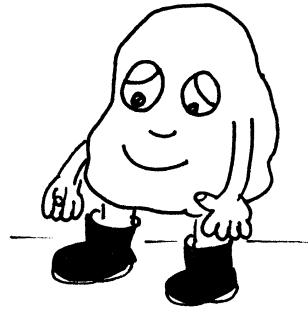
Draw a red circle around the things that move slowly.

The first person turns over the top picture, and tells the rest of the group what action to carry out... but also tells them to do it quickly... or slowly. Example: "Wave your hands... quickly!"

"Stand up... slowly"

Anyone who doesn't follow the instruction correctly is given a cross. The person with the least crosses wins the game. Each person in the group takes a turn until all the pictures have been used.

The snails don't want to go to bed so they are all moving slowly.

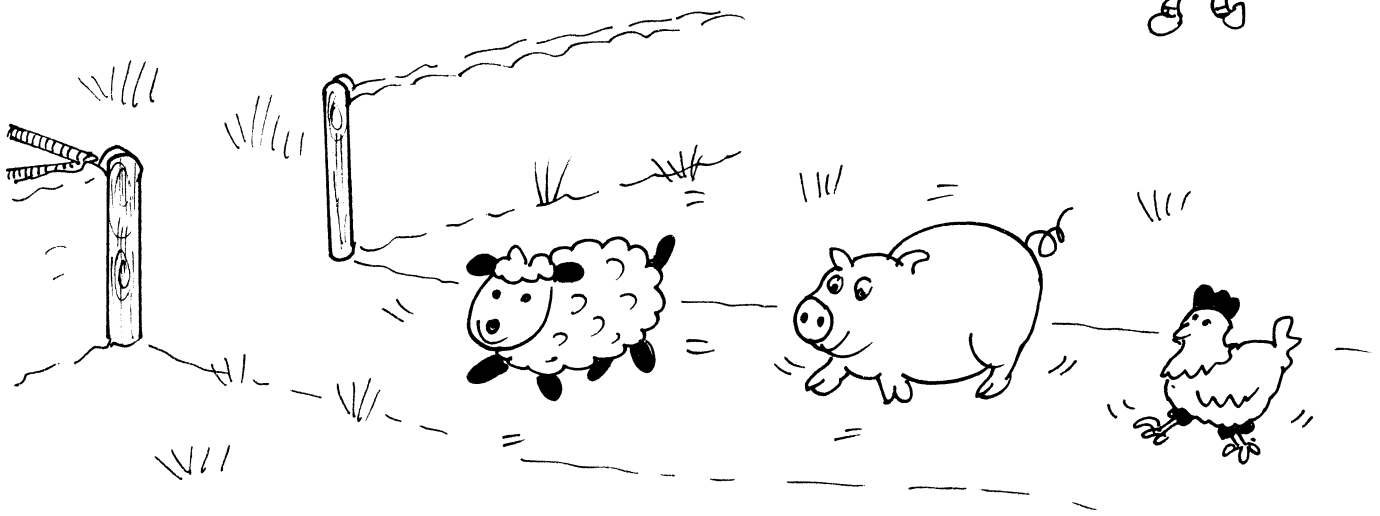
Look at the red snail (point to the red snail). He is very slow...

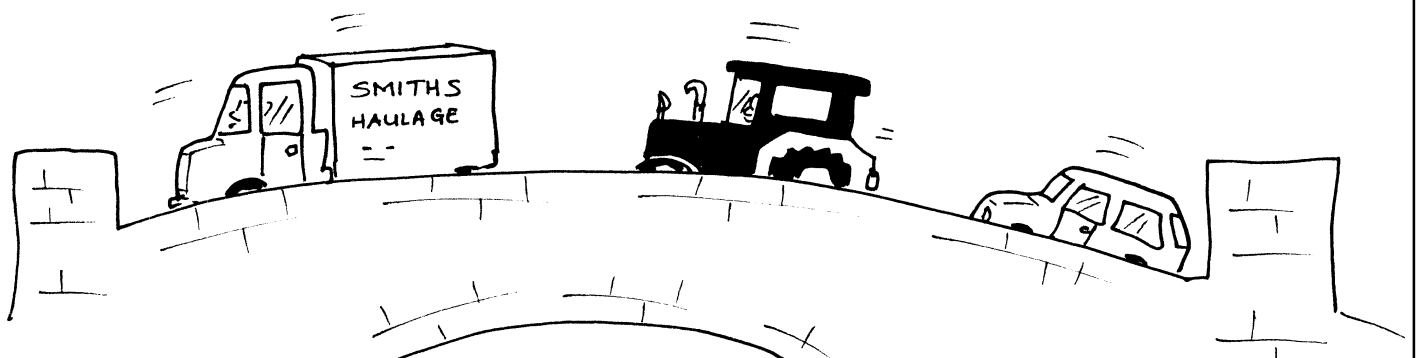
Look at these animals walking into the field. They are all walking quickly... but which one is the quickest?



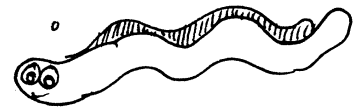
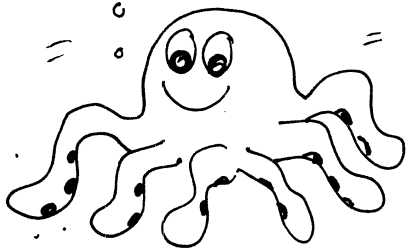
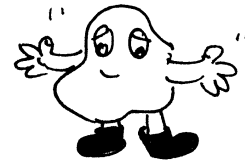
Look at these creepy crawlies walking across the grass. They are all walking quickly, but which one is the quickest?



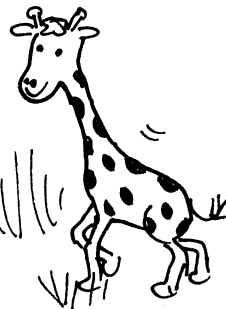
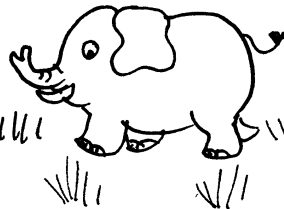
Look at these vehicles driving over a bridge. They are all driving quickly, but which one is the quickest?



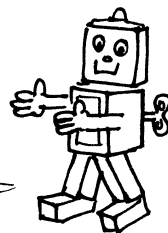
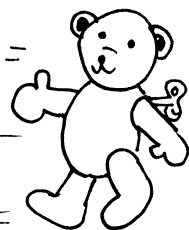
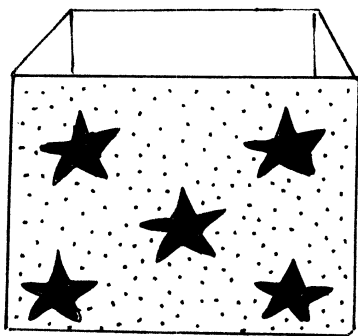
Look at these sea creatures swimming along the sea-bed. They are all swimming slowly, but which one is the slowest?

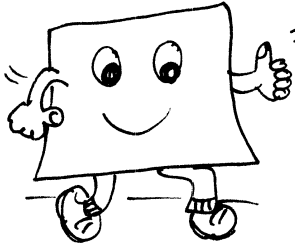


Look at these animals walking into the jungle. They are all walking slowly, but which one is the slowest?

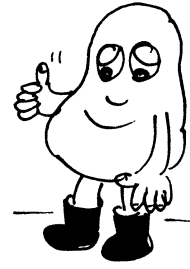


Look at these 'wind-up' toys going into the toy box. They are all moving slowly...but which one is the slowest





= You will need at least three people to play this game.



Cut out the pictures on page 12 ... and the words at the bottom of this page. Make three separate piles face down on the table (ie. pictures.. quick/quicker/quickest ... slow/slower/slowest)

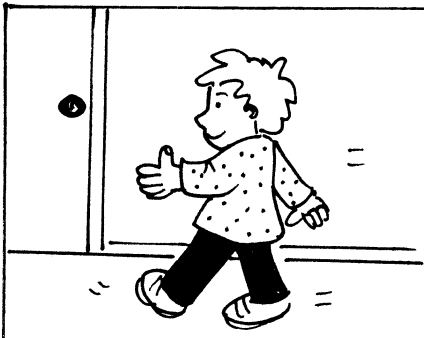
The first person to go takes an action picture ... tells the rest of the group what they have to do.. and also decides whether they are going to do it quickly..or slowly.

The 'chooser' then gives the appropriate word strips to three people in the group who then carry out the action according to the written instruction...

... so the 'slow' person begins... the 'slower' person joins in.. and finally the 'slowest' person. The rest of the group can decide who is slow..slower..etc.

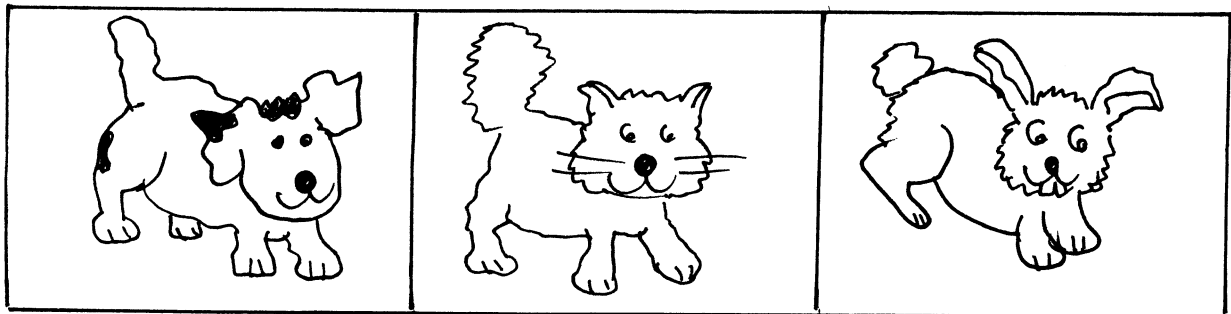
Cut out the animal pictures on this page to use with the background sheets on pages 14 and 15. You may wish to colour them in.

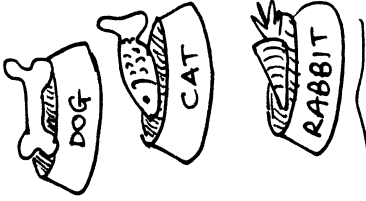


Decide between you whether the animals will be moving quickly...or slowly... and then who will be .. quick... quicker...quickest ... or slow... slower.. slowest

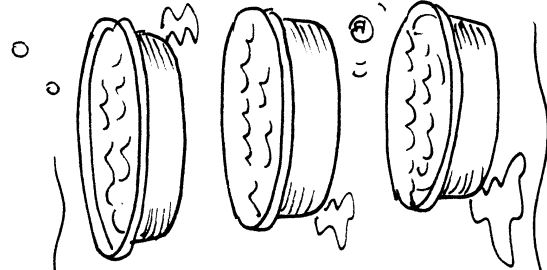
Help the child put them in the right order.. and to move them along.

Example: "I think they will all be running quickly down the hill. Who will be quick? ...oh, the dog! Yes, he's very quick! ... but who will be quicker than the dog? ... the cat! ...so where will he go? ...that means the rabbit is the quickest! Where does he go? ... So.. the dog is quick.. the cat is even ; and the rabbit is the " etc.

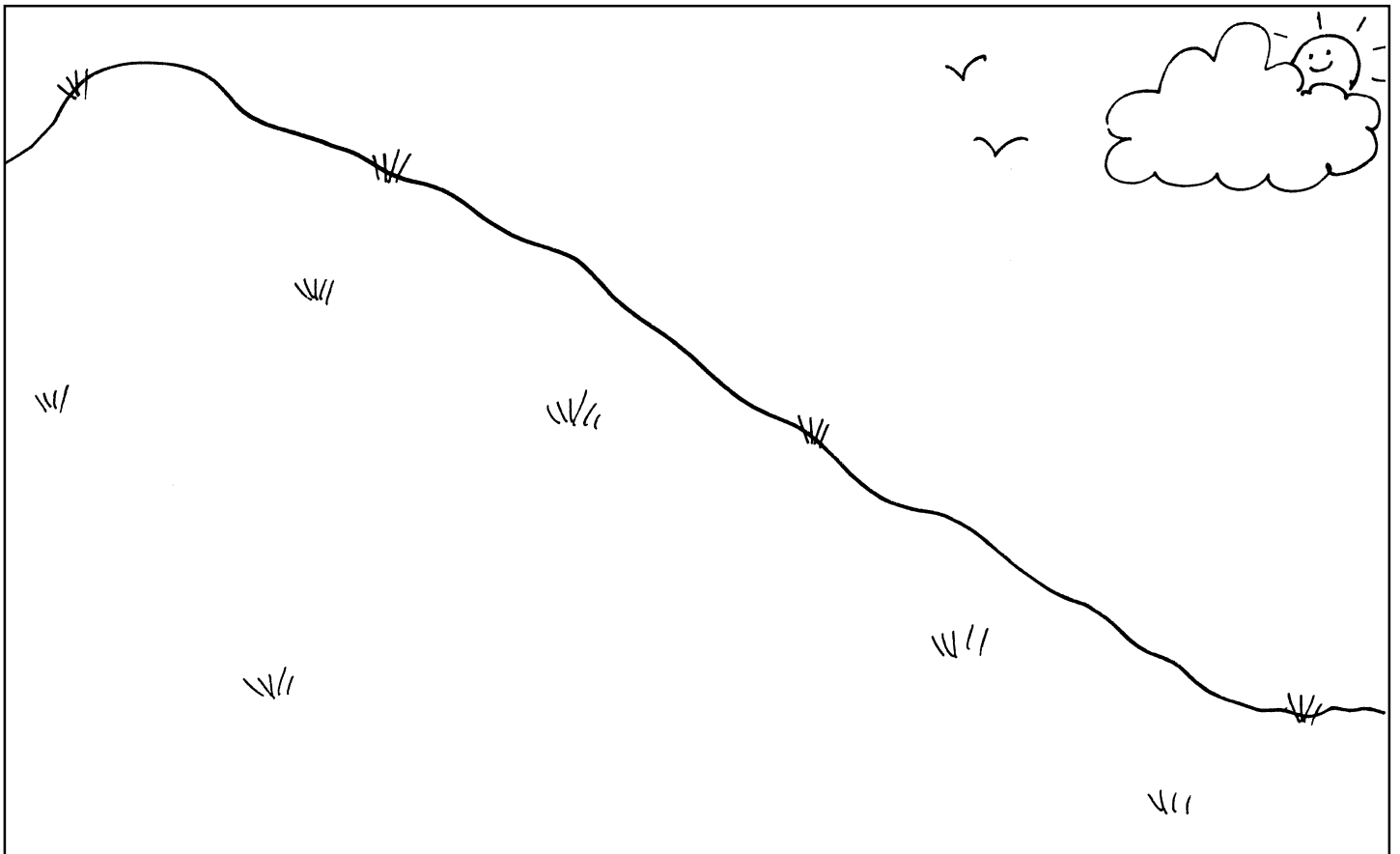




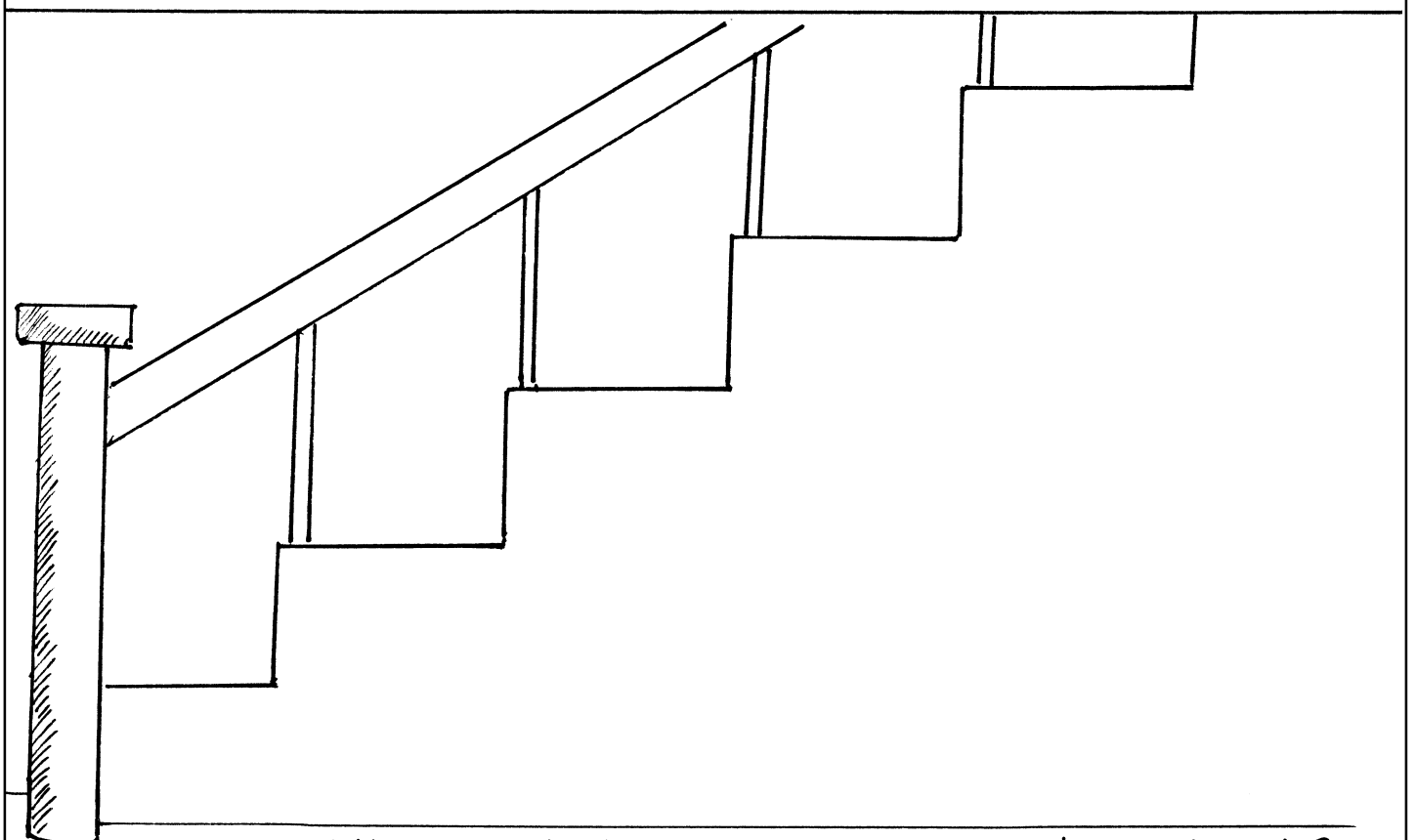
It's dinner time for the animals. They are very hungry ... so will they be walking quickly? ... or slowly? Who is quick...quicker..quickest?



It's bath-time for the animals. They don't like baths!.. so will they be walking quickly or slowly?



The animals are racing down the hill. Will they be moving quickly or slowly?



It's bedtime.. but the animals don't want to go to bed! Will they be going upstairs quickly or slowly?

Here are some difficult questions.. so listen hard, and try your best to answer them.



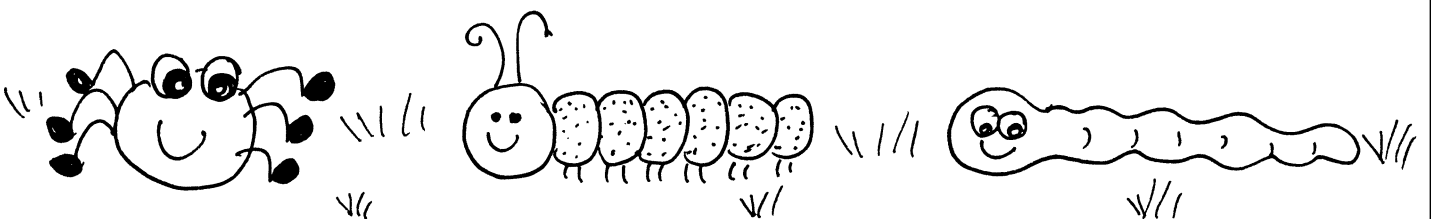
Here are a girl, a boy and a baby. They are walking slowly.

(he is the slowest)



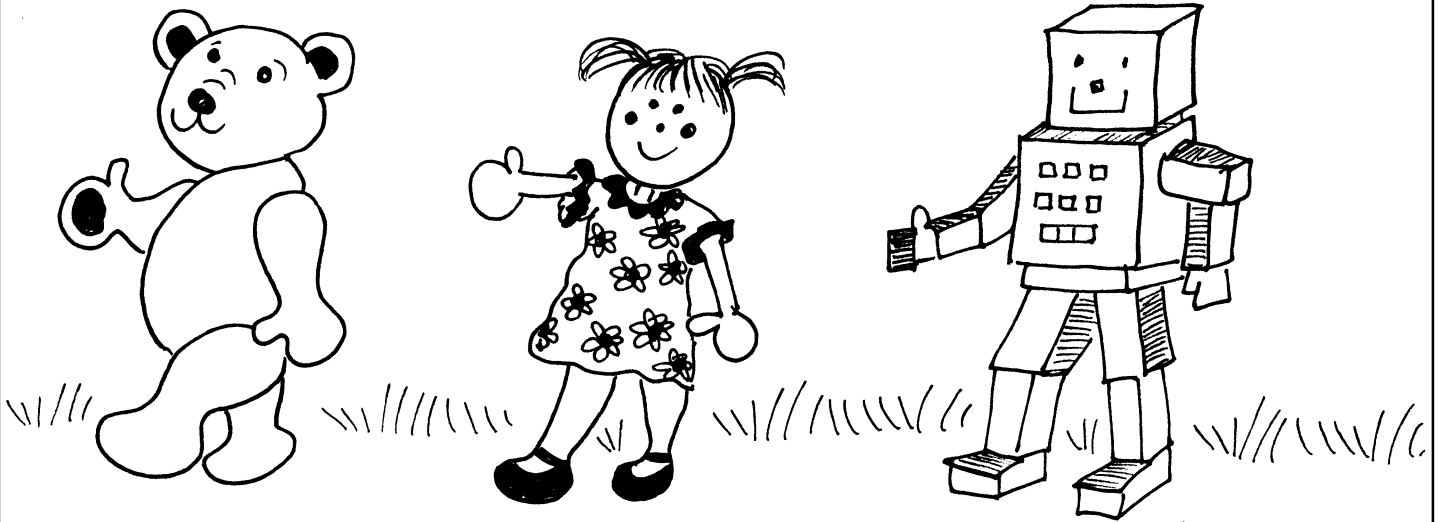
Here are a spider, a caterpillar, and a worm. They are walking quickly.

Who are quicker than the worm?

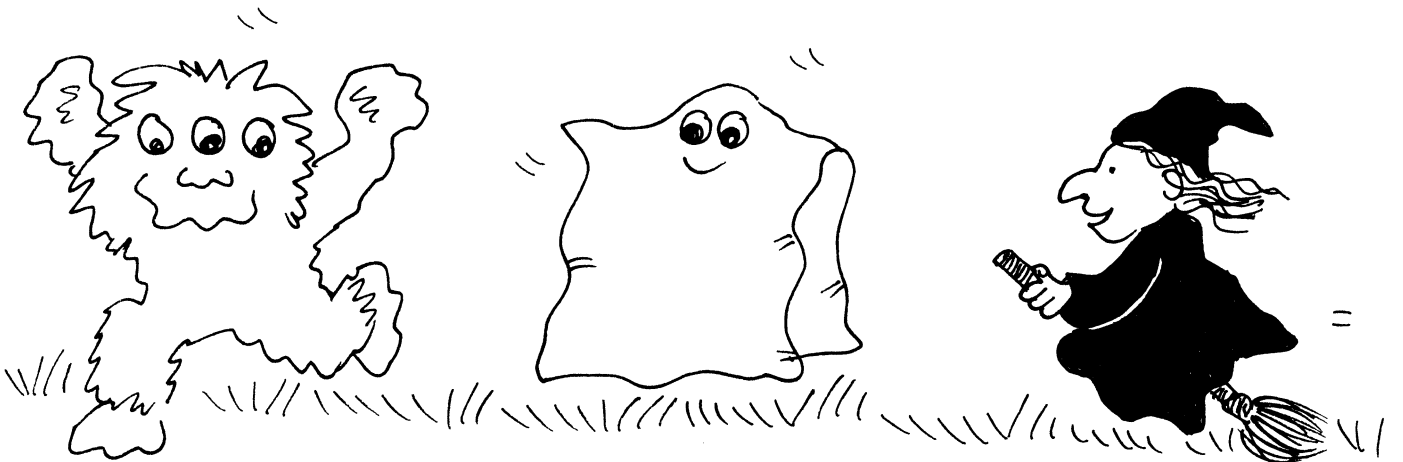
Who is the quickest?

Why not?

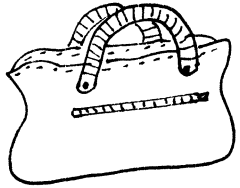


Look at the teddy, the doll, and the robot.

Who is the quickest?

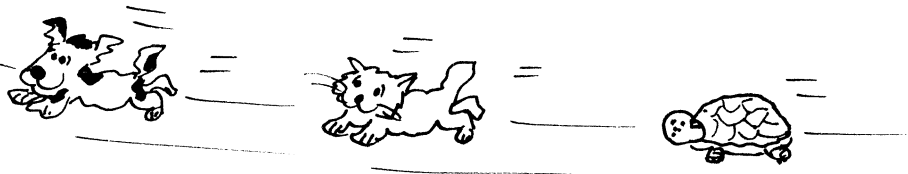
Listen to the story and then answer the questions.



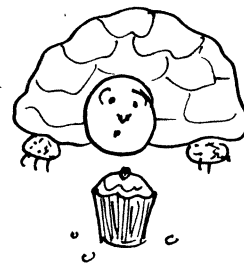
The cat, the dog and the tortoise decided to go shopping. They were very hungry and they wanted to buy some cakes.



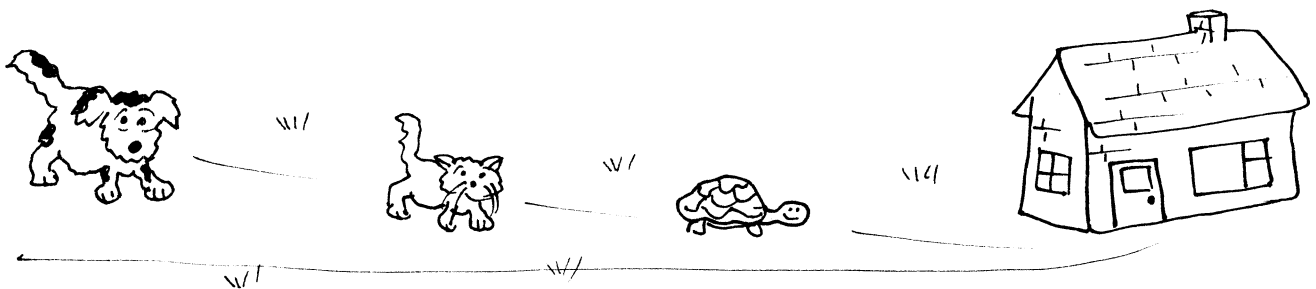
They ran all the way to the cake shop



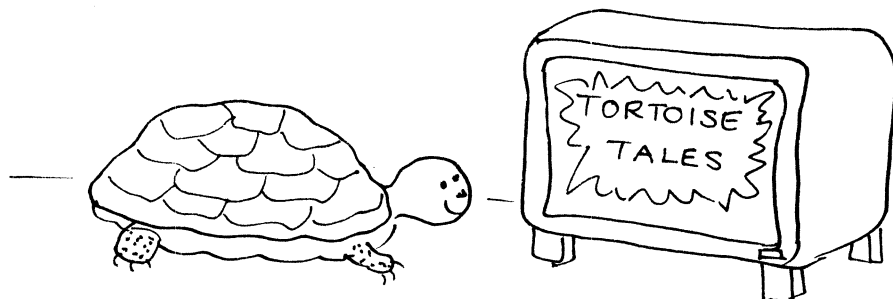
The tortoise was quick ... but the cat was quicker... and the dog was the quickest of them all!



The dog bought lots of cakes because he was the quickest, and got to the shop first!
The cat got to the shop next, because she was quicker than the tortoise. She bought lots of cakes ... but, by the time the tortoise arrived, there was only one cake left!
The animals gobbled up their cakes, and then decided to go home.
They were feeling very full and they walked slowly.



The tortoise was slow, but the cat was slower than him because she had eaten lots of cake ... and the dog was the slowest because he had eaten the most!



So the tortoise arrived home first, and was able to choose what to watch on the telly!
