They like things new!

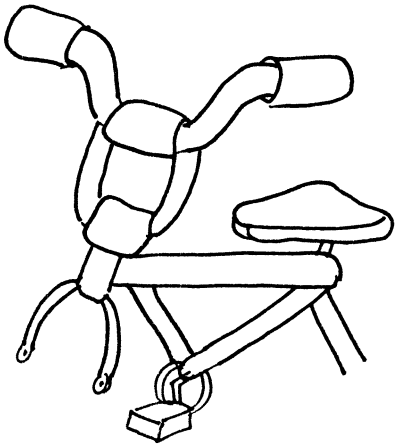
If something or someone is old, they have been around for a long time. If something is new, it's only been around a short time. Draw a circle around the old things.



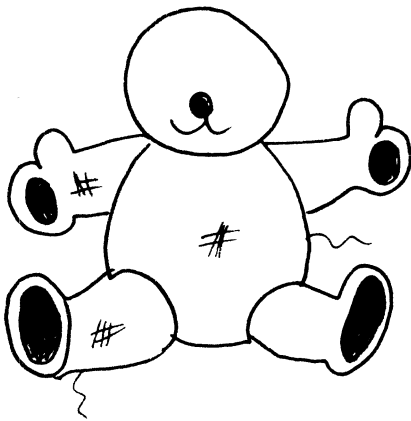
Find your pencils and make these things look old.



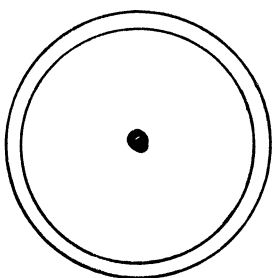
Draw mud all over this welly...

new teddy or an old teddy?



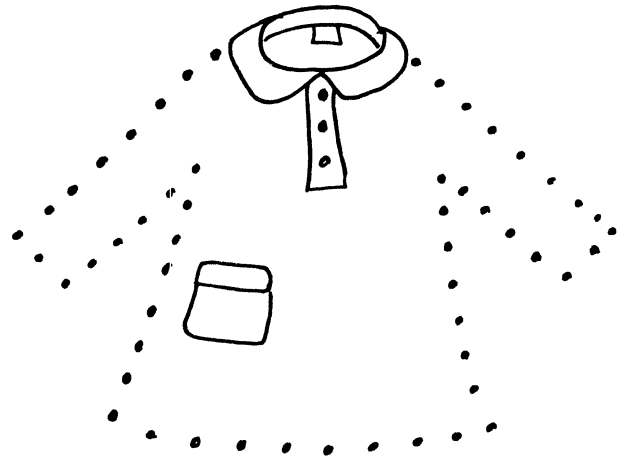

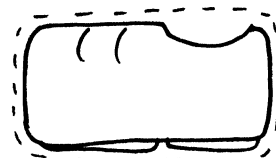
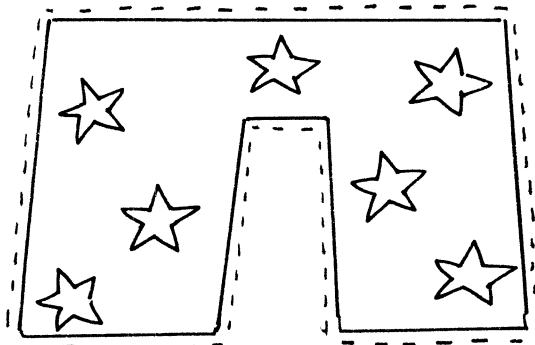
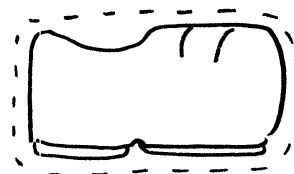
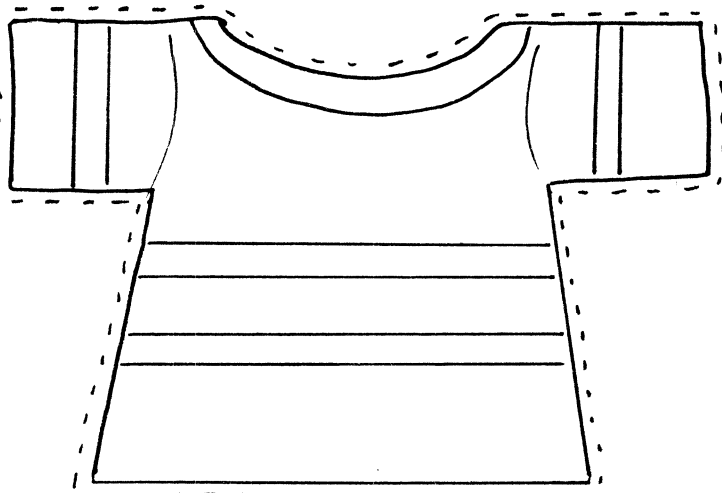
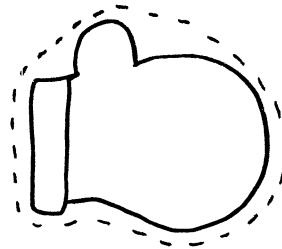
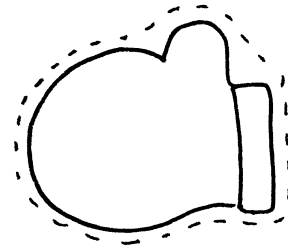
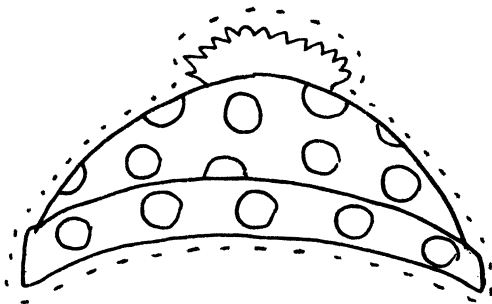
Teddy has fallen over and ruined his clothes.

... Adam.

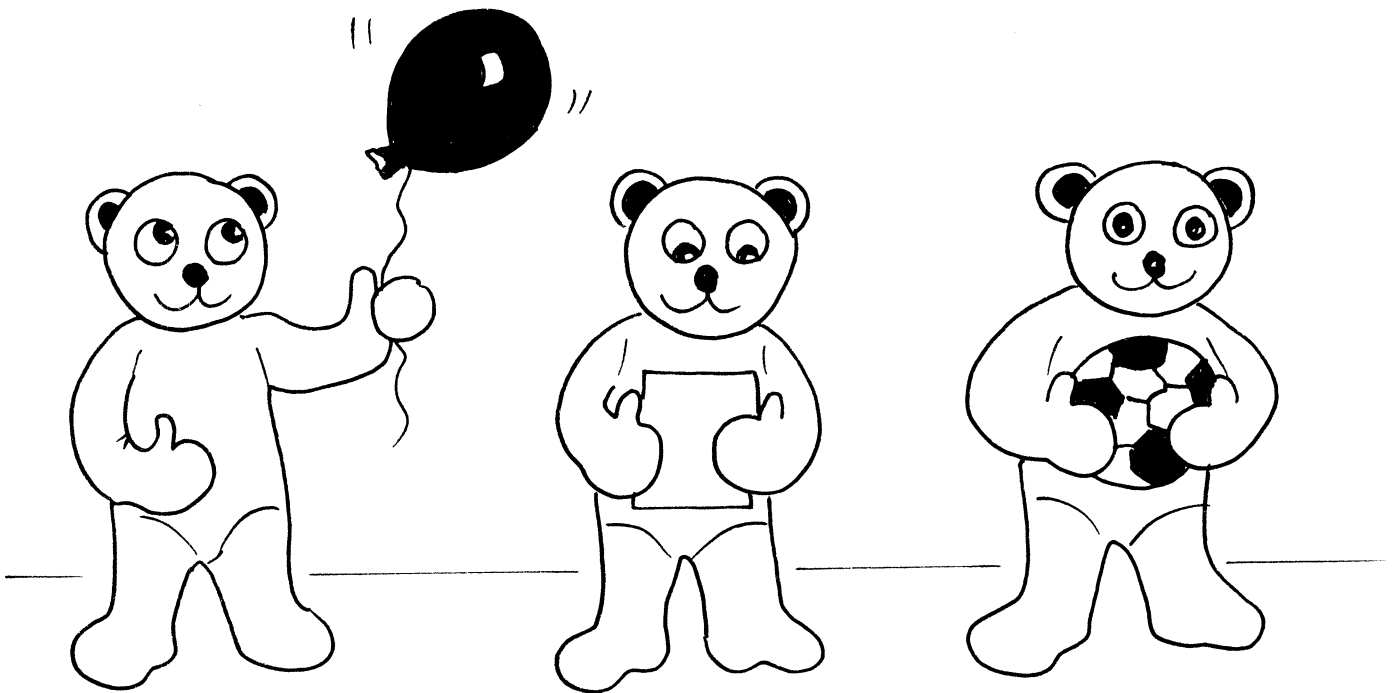
This is Adam's

because he only bought it today!

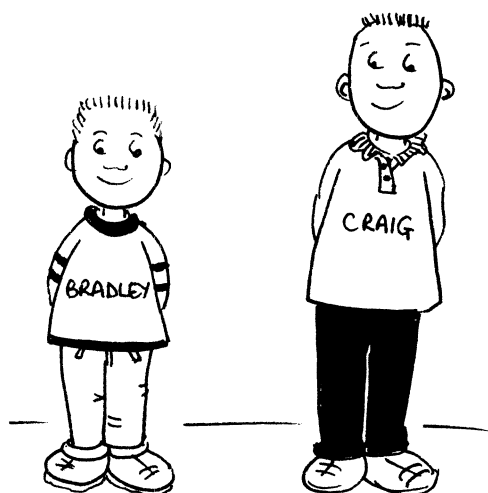

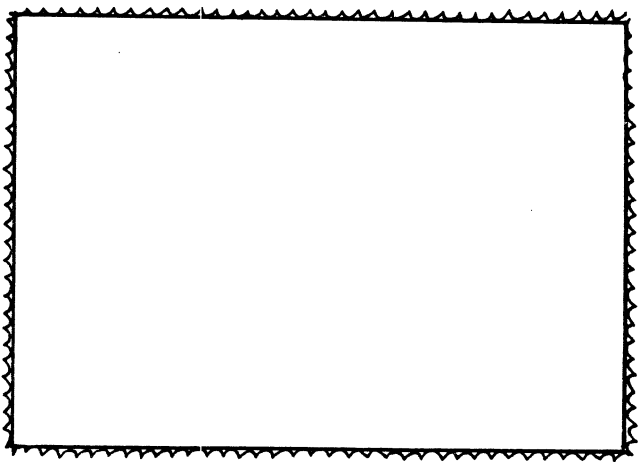
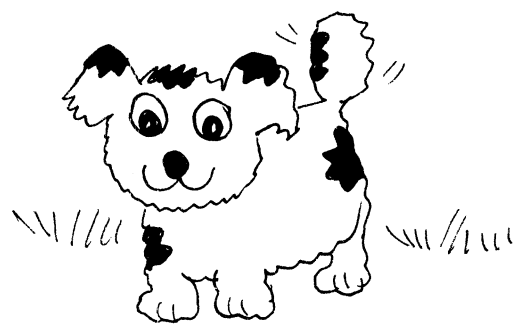
Here is a baby girl. In the box next to her, draw an older girl.



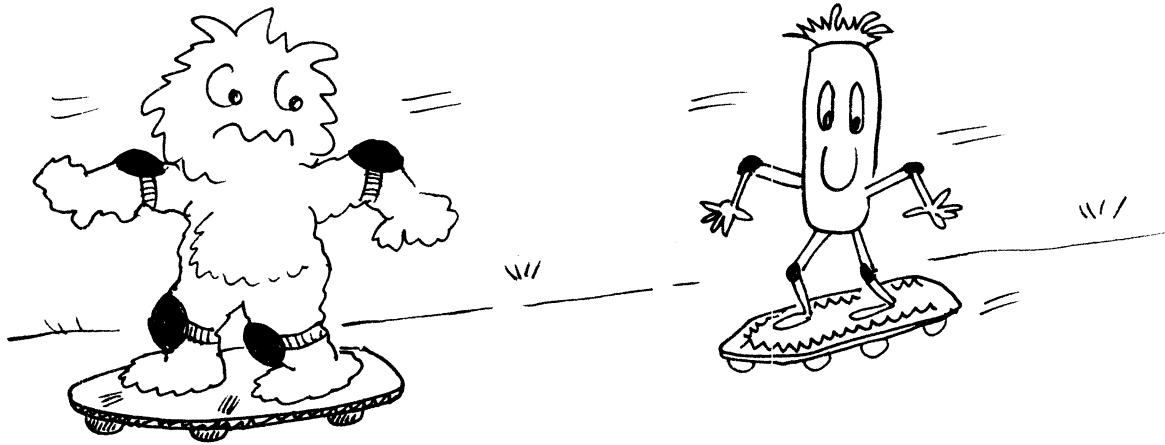
Here is the baby's old teddy. In the box next to him, draw a newer teddy.



Here is the baby's new puppy. In the box next to him, draw an older dog.



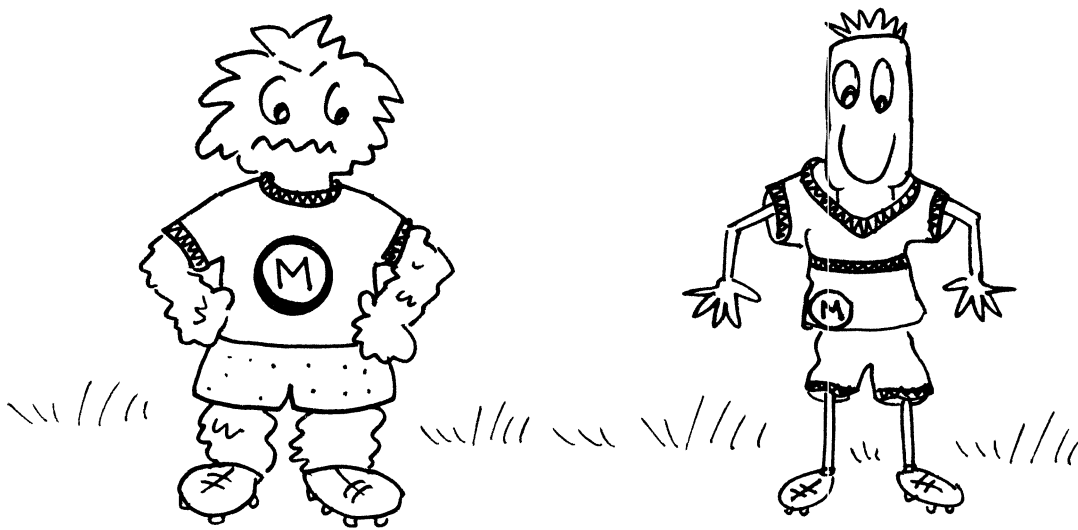
Mickey monster always wants to be better than anyone else! Listen to what he says.
