

Grammatical Class Spelling: Instructions for Use

This task looks for effects of grammatical word class in written spelling to dictation. Sets of 5 nouns, adjectives, verbs and functors were selected on the grounds they generally occur in the language in those particular grammatical roles. Words are matched across groups (on a one-to-one basis) as far as possible for word frequency and number of letters, syllables and morphemes. Nouns, adjectives and verbs are matched for imageability. The words are a reduced set of those used in Oral Reading [32] and Repetition [10]. As numbers in this task are so small, the task should be regarded as a screening test that must be followed up by more detailed investigation if the results suggest a specific difficulty.

Grammatical class effects in spelling to dictation (less success in spelling verbs and functors than nouns) have been noted in some acquired dysgraphic disorders (eg. Bub, D. & Kertesz, A. (1982) *Brain & Language*, 17, 145 - 165; Shallice, T. (1981) *Brain*, 104, 413 - 429). Such effects may be due to underlying syntactic-semantic difficulties, or may be due to the fact that words like functors, that often take a purely grammatical role, are generally lower in imageability than other word-classes.

Special Points:

Find out about pre-morbid spelling ability.

Descriptive Statistics (for 28 control subjects):

Adjectives	(n = 5)	Mean = 4.82	Std. Dev. = 0.48
Verbs	(n = 5)	Mean = 4.82	Std. Dev. = 0.39
Functors	(n = 5)	Mean = 4.68	Std. Dev. = 0.55

Suggestions for Where to go next: As there are only 5 words per condition in this task, any sign of particular difficulty in spelling words of a particular type should be investigated further by using the remainder of the grammatical class word set used to test reading aloud [32]. As with oral reading, grammatical class effects may be separated from those of imageability by testing performance on written spelling when imageability is equated across nouns and functors [42].
